Therefore, efforts from educators and educational institutions are needed to ensure that the available content is verified and relevant to religious principles. Additionally, digital religious education requires approaches that integrate religious learning with the development of positive behaviors that can be applied in everyday life.

Social media and other digital platforms have great potential in spreading religious values and strengthening individual character. However, it is also essential to be aware of the negative content that could harm the morals and character of students. Thus, supervision and digital literacy are crucial, involving families, schools, and religious institutions. Digital religious education must also prioritize interactivity and creativity to remain relevant and engaging for the tech-dependent younger generation.

With proper and correct digital religious education, character strengthening can be achieved more broadly and evenly, as it can reach individuals from various regions and socioeconomic backgrounds. With the right approach, digital religious education can produce individuals with strong character, ethics, and the ability to face the challenges of an increasingly digital world. Along with this, it is important to continue strengthening digital literacy and ensuring that religious values remain a moral foundation in the evolving digital society.

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
